

Pana Community Hospital Operational Changes

Pana Community Hospital, Community Medical Clinic, Pana Medical Group, LiveWell Fitness, Community Medical Clinic's ExpressCare announce the following operational changes in order to protect our patients, staff, members, and community during this pandemic.

These operational changes may be revised *AT ANY TIME*.

- Two visitors per patient are permitted to enter the facility. Please visit our website to read the policy in detail.
- Community Medical Clinic and Pana Medical Group (including all outlying clinics) continue operations subject to screening.
 - Video and phone visits are available.
 - In-person visits will be provided in the respiratory clinic for symptomatic patients.
- Community Medical Clinic's ExpressCare continues operations subject to screening.
- All patients and visitors seeking to enter the hospital will be screened outside the main and emergency entrances and will be required to wear a mask. All other entrances will be closed to the public until further notice.
- The LiveWell Program is open Monday-Friday 5-7AM and 4-8PM, Saturday 7-11AM for all normal services. Appointments are no longer necessary for gym visits. Classes should be booked in advance. Space is limited. Prospective clients call 562-6231 to make an appointment. Masks are required at all time in compliance with Governor's executive order.
- Public meetings held at Pana Community Hospital are suspended. The Harvest Cafe is open to employees, visitors, and PCH family members who are vaccinated.
- If you have a fever, cough, sore throat, or shortness of breath, please call your primary care provider for instructions before coming to the hospital or clinic.
