Operational Changes

Pana Community Hospital, Community Medical Clinic, Pana Medical Group, LiveWell Fitness, Community Medical Clinic's ExpressCare announce the following operational changes in order to protect our patients, staff, members, and community during this pandemic.

These operational changes may be revised AT ANY TIME.

- One visitor per patient is permitted to enter the facility.
- Everyone will be screened for presence of COVID-19 symptoms. If COVID symptoms are present, you will be required to wear an N-95 mask before entering the hospital.
- Everyone in the hospital will be required to wear a mask.
- No one under the age of 18 is permitted to wait in the public areas, unless being seen as a patient.
- Community Medical Clinic and Pana Medical Group (including all outlying clinics) continue operations subject to screening. Specialized scheduling will be utilized for symptomatic patients.
- Community Medical Clinic's ExpressCARE continues operations subject to screening.
- The LiveWell Program is open Monday-Friday 5-7AM and 4-8PM, Saturday 7-11AM for all normal services. Classes should be booked in advance. Space is limited. Prospective clients call 562-6231 to make an appointment. Masks are required at all times.
- Public meetings held at Pana Community Hospital are suspended. The Harvest Cafe is open to employees, visitors, and PCH family members who are vaccinated.

If you have a fever, cough, sore throat, or shortness of breath, please call your primary care provider for instructions before coming to the hospital or clinic.

If you do not have a primary care provider and are experiencing COVID symptoms, call the Christian County Health Department at 824-4113 or the Illinois Department of Public Health COVID-19 hotline at 1-800-889-3931.
