These highly trained physicians work on a rotating basis at Pana Community Hospital managing day-to-day care and providing prompt and complete attention to the needs of the patient from the time they are admitted to PCH until they are discharged.

Pana Community Hospital New In-House MRI Caring Suite Opens March 2023!

The Diagnostic Imaging Department is proud to announce the MRI Caring Suite is fully operational and open to patient scheduling as of March 2023. This exciting development has been planned for years and because of an unexpected blessing, was made possible in 2023!

Plans Develop and Unexpected Blessings Arrive

The original building project that began in 2017 included plans for an in-house MRI to replace the mobile unit. A large room was built on the first floor of the new addition and used for storage until funds could be raised for the MRI suite. Thanks to the generosity of an anonymous donor as well as donations from our community, the hospital was able to purchase the magnet and begin work on the suite many years sooner than expected. In December of 2022, the room was ready for the 16,000 pound magnet. A portion of the exterior wall had to removed for the magnet to be lifted into the room.

Foundation Presents Check for MRI Caring Suite

In February of 2023, the Foundation presented a check in the amount of \$2,575,000 to Pana Community Hospital to fund the cost of the project! "The Foundation is proud to support this project which would not be possible without the generous support of our donors. MRI Caring Suite Opens

In late February of 2023, IDPH gave its' final approval and patient scheduling began. The GE magnet is a 3 Tesla (or 3T) which is the strength of the magnet. This MRI produces extremely detailed images especially useful to the Orthopedic surgeons that now offer joint replacement



physicians and providers what technical features would best suit their needs. With the physician's input and collaboration, we selected the highest quality

imaging to best serve our patients," stated Cindy Miles Diagnostic Imaging Director.

What Makes the MRI Caring Suite at PCH Different?

The suite offers both visual and audio components to comfort those who are claustrophobic or apprehensive about being scanned. Patients can choose the type of music, lighting and images that appear on screens located in the ceiling and on the portable television. Therefore, if you love calming music with pastel lights and scenes of the ocean, that is exactly what you can have. Options for children can include watching a movie while being scanned so they are not scared. "This room is one of a kind," stated CEO Trina Casner. "We wanted an MRI suite that provides the highest quality images with a patient experience that is calming and like no other imaging suite in our area and that is exactly what we got!"

Vickie Coen, Chief Clinical Officer/ Nurse Executive Retires

After 40 years of service to Pana Community Hospital, Vickie Coen retired in April 2023. Coen, who served as the Hospital's Chief Clinical Officer/Nurse Executive has provided patient focused leadership which included previous roles for PCH as Quality Management Services Director and Chief Nursing Officer.


